Horticulturist Chris Seale reviewed the following report:

Completed Projects

- Poston Gardens donated 6500 tulips. 4000 of them have been planted around Getzendaner Park
- MKT Parking Lot Landscape Project. The other 2500 Poston tulips have been planted in the circle bed.
- Irrigation at Broadhead Median #2 has been installed and wires pulled through to the next median.
- Phase 1 of the Chautauqua Landscape Renovation is nearing completion. All the irrigation has been retrofitted 21st century technology, flower beds installed and flowers are being delivered today.

Projects Currently Working On

- Ordered and received 4 new planters, from Equinox Industries, for the ADA ramps along Rogers Street. These planters have three planting areas to create a dramatic cascading effect coming off the ledge. These are self-watering and hold approximately 40 gallons of water a piece and will install and plant these towards the end of February with trailing petunias.
- Will be ordering plant material for Broadhead Road Median #2 towards the end of February when plant stock becomes available.
- An order will be placed for more Christmas decorations in the next couple of weeks through Arnett Marketing. Focusing on areas at the Civic Center and Chapman Park.
- Ewing Irrigation has received all the landscape lighting fixtures for Bynum Plaza. The manufacturer is now working on preprograming the DMX controller.
- Spring flower change out is right around the corner.
