1. Call to Order

Mayor David Hill called the meeting to order.

2. Conduct a briefing to discuss items for the 7:00 p.m. regular meeting

City Manager Michael Scott reviewed the following Consent Agenda items:

- a. June 1, 2020 City Council minutes
- b. Season Vendor Permit at Lake Waxahachie
- h. Amend Chapter 380 Agreement with Crepe Myrtle Enterprises & Showbiz Cinemas to extend the agreement to December 31, 2020 from October 31, 2020. Mr. Scott confirmed they are still being held to the same requirements from the original agreement.

Assistant City Manager Tommy Ludwig reviewed items c., d., and e. on the Consent Agenda noting the items are authorizing supplemental appropriations related to professional engineering services associated with the Impact Fee Capital Improvements Plan and Land Use Assumption Updates. He noted specifically the supplement appropriations will be funded from the Roadway Impact Fee Fund to the General Fund in the amount of \$12,500, the Water Impact Fee Fund to the Water Fund in the amount of \$10,000 and the Waste Water Impact Fee Fund to the Waste Water Fund in the amount of \$10,000. Staff has determined that a more efficient approach would be to include the entire Thoroughfare Plan, Water Master Plan, and Waste Water Master Plan in the Impact Fee Capital Improvement Plan.

Utilities Director David Bailey reviewed items f. and g. on the Consent Agenda requesting approval for the annual contract renewal with Evoqua Water Technologies. He also reviewed the bid for various chemicals required for Water Treatment operations at the Howard Road and Sokoll Water Treatment Plants.

Planning Director Shon Brooks reviewed the following items:

• 7 & 8, the applicant requested to continue the Public Hearing to the July 6, 2020 meeting.

• 9, 10, & 11, the owner agreed to remove the shredder from the site due to continuous fire concerns. He explained legal counsel for the City and the applicant worked together to draft a Development Agreement for the property.

Council inquired about options for non-compliance and City Attorney Robert Brown noted contract obligations could be settled in court and code enforcement issues could be settled through the city. He explained the business is able to operate without a Specific Use Permit due to the current zoning as long as they are not operating a machine that would produce excess noise. Chief Ricky Boyd noted this Development Agreement allows the city to be restrictive and ensure restrictions are adhered to.

Director of Engineering and Public Works James Gaertner reviewed the College Street Drainage engineering proposal from Freese and Nichols, Inc. in the amount of \$310,497. He explained the services will include design and preparation of construction plans, specification for drainage improvements, sanitary sewer replacement, and associated pavement replacement.

1. Call to Order

Mayor David Hill called the meeting to order.

2. Discuss preliminary budgetary outlook for Fiscal Year 2020-21

City Manager Michael Scott explained the FY 21 budget process has started and there are various financial aspects that are still pending.

Finance Director Charlie Harris reviewed the preliminary appraisal district numbers as of now but explained about 13% of the appraisals are currently being protested. He explained the appreciation as of January 1st is about 10% and growth about 5%. After protest hearings, he estimates a reduction to 8% appreciation and 4% growth. The current debt rate is 17 cents and noted existing debt on outstanding bonds will decrease.

The Operations & Maintenance cap is optional this year due to the pandemic and Mr. Harris encouraged Council to continue to plan ahead. He explained if Council votes not to collect the allowable amount of tax then they will not be able to catch up in the future. He stressed the importance of future financial planning.

Mr. Scott explained the direction from City Council is to provide some relief to citizens therefore, the proposed FY21 debt rate is 15 cents and noted this is the right time to reduce due to the high debt rolling off this year.

Re: Consider Budget Amendment for Downtown Development—Professional

Services

Item Description: Consider approving a budget amendment increasing the 2019-2020 Downtown Development – Professional Services budget by \$14,225.

Item Summary: As part of the viaduct project TxDOT is required to provide mitigation for the loss of one of our historic structures. The mitigation must relate to the resource that is being destroyed. The Heritage Preservation Commission has worked with TxDOT and their subcontractors for several years to come up with five informational panels that address appropriate topics related to the viaduct project and Waxahachie. These panels will be fabricated and placed in a selected area by the amphitheater parking lot. This spot was chosen as it is close to the actual project and can relate the information in proximity to what it applies to.

The requested funds cover fabrication of the panels, stands that will hold the signage, shipping, and setting the stands with panels in place at the selected location. The cost of this project will be fully reimbursed by TxDOT but must be paid for upfront by the city.

Fiscal Impact: The proposed budget amendment would increase the Downtown Development – Professional Services (100-180-53200) budget from \$25,000 to \$39,225. These additional funds would come from the General Fund unrestrictive reserve balance. The reserve balance has sufficient funds available to absorb the additional expenditure with no significant impact.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS, DIRECTING THE ELLIS COUNTY TAX OFFICE TO CALCULATE THE VOTER-APPROVAL TAX-RATE FOR TAX YEAR 2020 IN THE MANNER PROVIDED FOR A SPECIAL TAXING UNIT AT 8 PERCENT.

WHEREAS, beginning in or about December 2019, a novel coronavirus, now designated COVID-19, has spread through the world and has now been declared a global pandemic by the World Health Organization; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Texas Governor Greg Abbott declared a state of disaster in all Texas counties, including Ellis County; and

WHEREAS, the City of Waxahachie, Texas ("City"), is located in Ellis County; and

WHEREAS, Section 26.04(c-1) of the Texas Tax Code provides that the governing body of a taxing unit located in an area declared to be a disaster area by the Governor or by the President of the United States may direct the designated officer of the taxing unit to calculate the voter-approval tax rate in the manner provided for a special taxing unit at 8 percent; and

WHEREAS, Section 26.07(b) of the Texas Tax Code gives cities the ability to avoid an automatic tax rate election following certain disasters; and

WHEREAS, the Ellis County Tax Office is the designated officer of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Resolution as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2. The City hereby requests, in accordance with Section 26.04(c-1) of the Texas Tax Code, that the Ellis County Tax Office calculate the voter-approval tax rate for tax year 2020 in the manner provided for a special taxing unit at 8 percent.

SECTION 3. The City Manager is hereby authorized to exercise any and all options available for declared emergencies in accordance with The Texas Reform and Transparency Act of 2019 (Senate Bill 2) to ensure the continued financial health of the City.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
