Gary,

Here is my thought process on your situation. You have a member who went out on a service retirement and died a few months later. Section 4.01.b. of your plan document states "to receive disability retirement benefits, a Firefighter must file an application with the Board of Trustees." Section 1.07 of your plan document defines "Firefighter" shall mean any actively employed employee of the Waxahachie Fire Department...." From that perspective I believe the 2/3 benefit the spouse is currently receiving is a service retirement benefit and fully taxable. The member does not have the ability to apply for a disability once they are no longer active.

As a hypothetical, if a firefighter, when still active, filed for and was granted a disability pension, the 20 year portion of his pension in my non-legal eyes would be tax free because you could interpret that benefit as not being based on year of service (to follow workmen's compensation act) because you have a 20 year minimum for the calculation. If that was the case I would be inclined to say that the spousal benefit would also be tax free to the extent of 2/3 of the minimum 20 years following pro-rata logic.

You have a very unique circumstance where the State of Texas ruled that the death was a line of duty death (which I have never experienced) and there is no direction in your plan document on how that type of situation is handled. My recommendation would be that you hire an attorney familiar with Texas pension laws to opine on your situation. How does the State of Texas ruling impact the definitions and procedures in your plan document? I am not sure if there is case law on this or not. If you need attorney recommendations happy to provide the names of people/firms I know are active in this market.

Sorry couldn't give you more of a concrete answer but it is a very unique situation.

Here is the full subsection at 104 (a)(6).

Focus on the highlighted paragraph at the very end. I think what this likely means is that if a death benefit would have otherwise been paid, the benefit is taxable.

(6) amounts received pursuant to-

(A)

section 1201 of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796); [1] or

(B)

a program established under the laws of any State which provides monetary <u>compensation</u> for surviving dependents of a public safety officer who has died as the direct and proximate result of a personal injury sustained in the line of duty,

except that subparagraph (B) shall not apply to any amounts that would have been payable if death of the public safety officer had occurred other than as the direct and proximate result of a personal injury sustained in the line of duty
