1. Call to Order

Mayor David Hill called the meeting to order.

Convention and Visitors Bureau Director Laurie Mosley introduced Ms. Kelly Skistimas, Cultural Arts & Programming Manager, noting she will oversee the bookings of the Amphitheater. Ms. Skistimas stated she is excited to be a part of the CVB team and is already working on a calendar and logo for the Amphitheater.

2. Conduct a briefing to discuss agenda items for the 7:00 p.m. regular meeting

City Manager Michael Scott reviewed the Consent Agenda and spoke on item 4e; approval of Supplemental Appropriation and loan to Roadway Impact Fee Service Area 2 associated with the Vista Way Development Agreement. He explained in 2018 City Council approved a cost sharing development agreement with John Houston Homes which authorized the City to contribute \$750,000 toward the construction of Vista Way. Mr. Scott stated staff anticipated being able to fully fund the City's share of the construction cost through the use of Roadway Impact Fees. He explained, since that time, final pricing for the project has come in and only \$571,267 of the cost are eligible for payment by Roadway Impact Fees. Mr. Scott stated staff is requesting a supplemental appropriation from the General Fund in the amount of \$178,733 to fully fund the development agreement with John Houston Homes. Mr. Scott stated the expected completion date of Vista Way is June 2020. He stated staff anticipates that there will be more than sufficient funding in Roadway Impact Fee Service Area 2 to fully fund the total impact fee eligible cost by June 2020. Since there are currently insufficient funds to cover the full cost of construction, staff requested City Council to authorize a loan to Roadway Impact Fees Service Area 2, if needed, not to exceed \$106,985. Mr. Scott stated if the loan was needed, the General Fund would be fully reimbursed once funding became available with Service Area 2.

Planning Director Shon Brooks reviewed the following cases:

• PP-19-0080, applicant proposing Preliminary Plat to divide one lot into two lots. Staff recommended approval.



- FP-19-0081, companion case to PP-19-0080. Staff recommended approval.
- RP-19-0082, applicant proposing Replat to divide one lot into four lots. Staff recommended approval per staff comments due to applicant is working through some final details.
- SU-19-0085, applicant proposes a roof top solar panel system. Staff recommended approval.
- SU-19-0084, applicant proposes outdoor display for outdoor patio furniture and will only be used for patio furniture display. The store will have a facelift and an eight foot brick wall will be at the rear of the property. The ice machine will be removed. Staff recommended approval.
- PD-19-0022, applicant requested to continue to the City Council meeting of August 19, 2019.

Mr. Scott reviewed the proposed tax rate noting the 2019-2020 budget has been constructed assuming to maintain a \$0.68/\$100 tax rate. He stated staff is requesting the first public hearing on the tax rate to be set for Wednesday, August 21st at 12:00 p.m.

Assistant City Manager Tommy Ludwig reported three air handling units at City Hall failed affecting the Finance Department, the Building and Community Services Department, the City's Server Room, and the Break Room. He stated staff authorized the replacement of three air handling units on July 31, 2019. Mr. Ludwig stated there are insufficient funds in the Facilities fiscal year 2018-2019 budget and requested an emergency ratification to increase the Facilities budget in the amount of \$25,664.80.

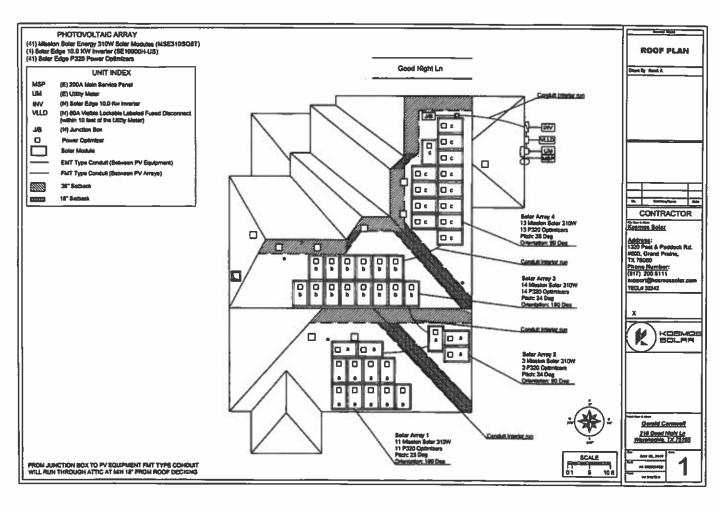

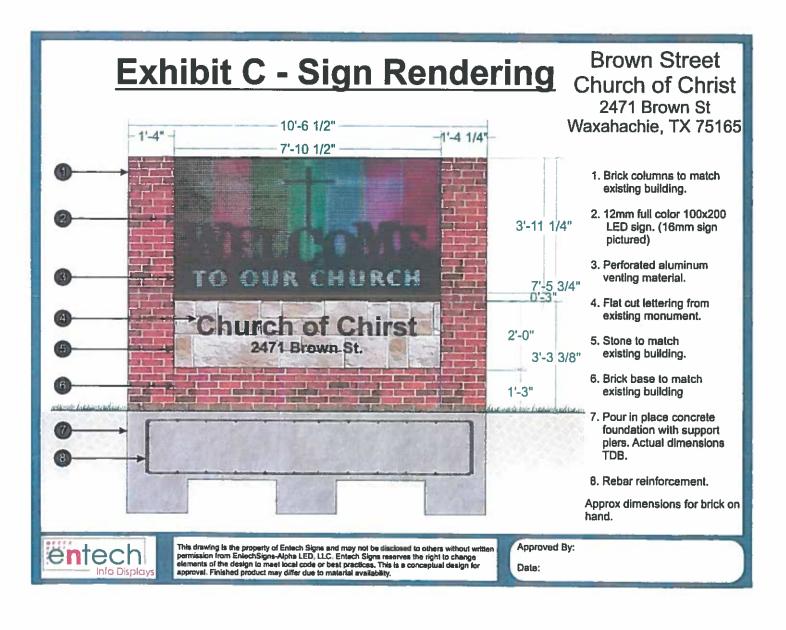




Exhibit B - Site Plan

AREAS OF CONCERN

-Water Tower:

Per the Site Plan, the applicant is proposing a water tower on the west side of the existing building. Due to the size and location of the water tower, staff has concerns with the applicant not being able to provide sufficient screening for the water tower along Interstate 35.

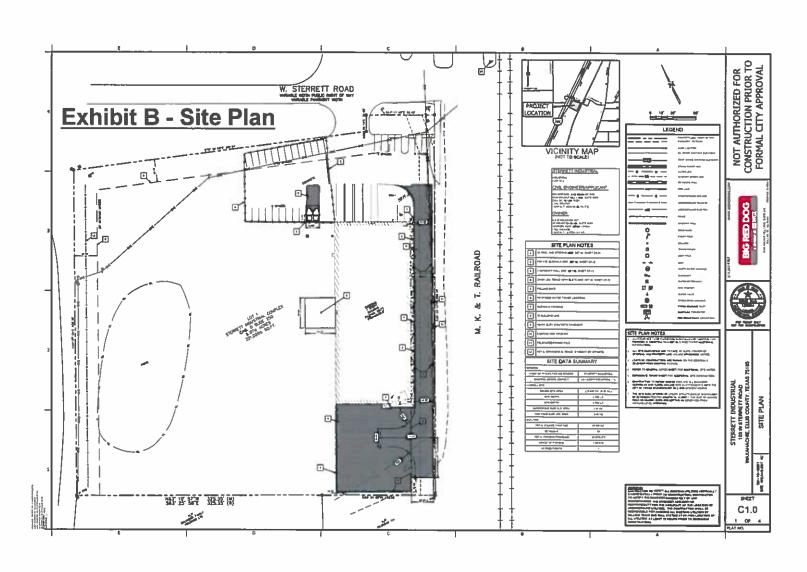

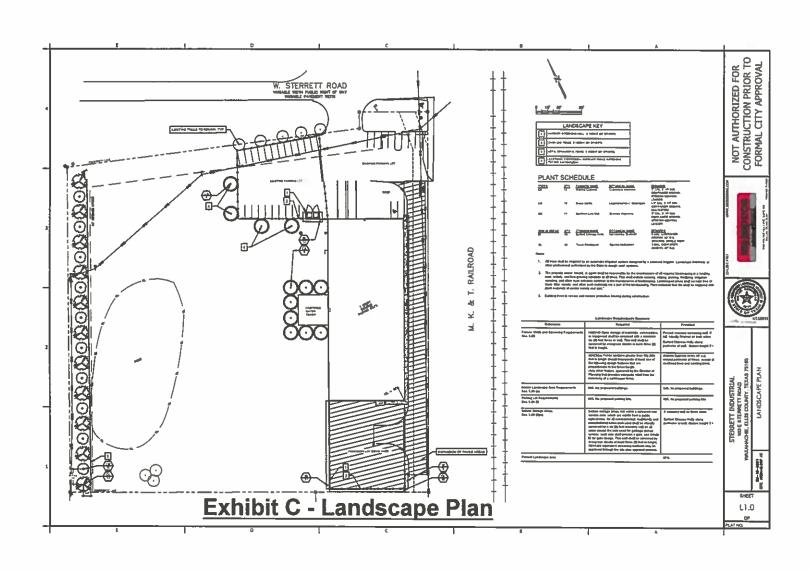

Please accept this letter as our intended business plan for the facility located at 103 W Sterrett Rd, Waxahachie, Tx.

First, SRS Distribution Inc. consists of a family of industry-leading, independent roofing distributors with a common goal and purpose: to focus all of our efforts on serving the professional roofing contractor. More on our company can be found on our website at: http://srsdistribution.com/Default.aspx.

Regarding Sterrett Rd, we would like to open one of our typical building materials distribution facilities. This would include a showroom/office for our sales staff and customer ordering. Customers can pick up materials and we also deliver with our specialized delivery vehicles. Our intent is to store materials in the warehouse, outside in the new yard area at the back of the site. Our typical hours are Monday through Friday 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM. Initially, we anticipate 3 delivery vehicles and could be receiving 5-10 deliveries per day. The location would employ 7-9 full time employees.

In the warehouse, we would store items of great value, those that cannot get wet or exposed to elements and those that are frequently picked up. Examples would be rolled goods, roofing nails in boxes and tools. Most of these items would be palletized (except tools, etc.) and many will be stored in racks. Items like roofing felts and coil nails would be stacked in pallets due to the high volume of sales anticipated for these items. 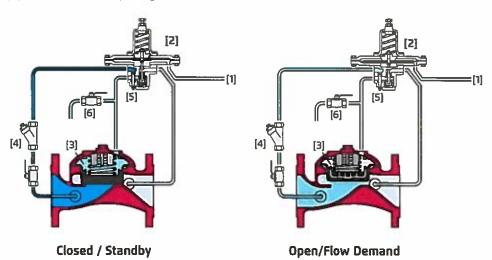
The Model FP 450-82 is a pilot controlled valve equipped with an adjustable, #82 attitude pilot valve. The pilot valve senses the static head of the reservoir level via a sensing tube [1] connected to a "still point" at the bottom of the reservoir.

The Model TTS is a water tank temperature supervisory switch preset to give a low temperature signal at $40^{\circ}F/4,5^{\circ}C$ and a high temperature signal at $140^{\circ}F/60^{\circ}C$ ($\pm 5^{\circ}F/3^{\circ}C$). It is UL Listed and FM Approved. A bi-metal thermostat is used for low temperature sensing and a bi-metal thermostat for high temperature sensing. A diode is used in this unit as a testing aid. When the polarity of DC current is reversed at the feed wires to a TTS, the diode in the circuit prevents the flow of current, proving the absence of a short circuit fault in the wiring or the device itself.

Testing

To test for a short or open in the TTS, connect an ohmmeter across the white and black TTS leads. With the meter connected positive to white and negative to black, the meter will read continuity (about 1 meg ohm). With the meter connected reverse polarity, the meter will read open. If using the diode tester setting on the meter, the meter will read .5 observing polarity and open with reverse polarity.

To test the thermostat, the device must be exposed to temperatures of 40°F and 140°F. The appropriate thermostat will open creating an open circuit regardless of polarity.

Wiring

The TTS is normally closed device that opens when the probe is exposed to the operating temperature of the thermostats. The device is polarity sensitive. The positive leg of the initiating device circuit must

be connected to the white wire lead. The negative leg of the initiating device circuit must be connected to the black wire lead.

If the TTS is the last or only device on the initiating circuit, the EOLR must be wired in series with the TTS. It can be wired in series with either the black or white wire.

The TTS, tank temperature switch is supplied with a one inch pipe thread for steel tanks (Model TTS-S) or with a buttress thread for wood tanks (Model TTS-W).

A buttress thread nut and gasket are available for use with the TTS-W for installations where the inside of the tank is accessible and it is not convenient to weld a flange on the tank.

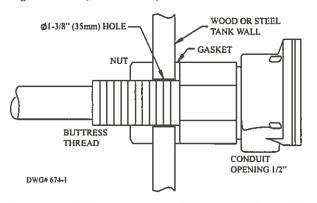
The nut and gasket can also be used on a wood tank, which is not sound enough to hold a thread (see Fig. 1). Locate the switch at a point 24" (60cm) below the required water level of the tank.

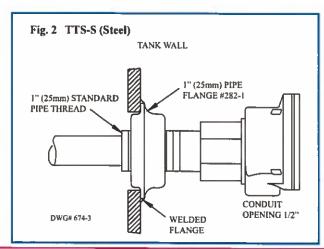
For steel tanks, weld in a No. 282-1 pipe flange or drill and tap tank to receive the one inch pipe thread of the bushing (see Fig. 2).

For wood tanks, drill a 1 3/16" (30mm) hole in the center of a stave and thread the bushing into the tank allowing the buttress bushing to cut its own thread (see Fig. 3).

Fig. 3 TTS-W (Wood)

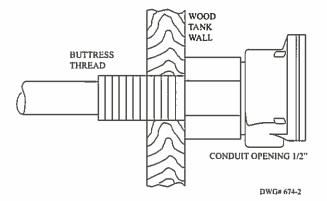
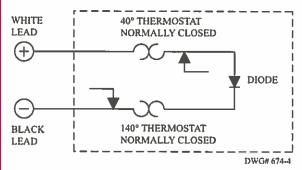
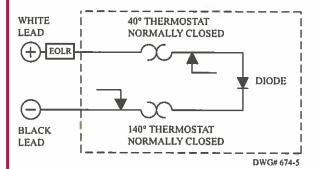


Fig. 4 TTS-S Simplified Schematic

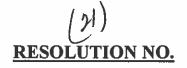

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS, ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY NOVEMBER 5, 2019, FOR THE PURPOSE OF VOTING "YES" OR "NO" ON A PROPOSED HOME-RULE CHARTER AMENDMENT; PROVIDING FOR A CONTRACT FOR ELECTION SERVICES WITH ELLIS COUNTY ELECTIONS ADMINISTRATION; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY AND CONFLICTS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 41.001 of the Texas Election Code, as amended, establishes Tuesday, November 5, 2019, as a "uniform election date" for the purposes of conducting an election within the City of Waxahachie, Texas ("City"); and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Waxahachie, Texas ("City Council"), has determined to submit to the qualified voters of the City, in a special election, a proposition for the adoption or rejection of proposed amendment to the existing Home-Rule Charter of the City of Waxahachie, Texas ("City Charter"), pursuant to Section 9.004(a) of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the City has entered into a Joint Election Contract for Election Services ("<u>Election Services Contract</u>"), with the Ellis County Elections Administrator ("<u>Elections Administrator</u>") located at 204 E. Jefferson Street, Waxahachie, Texas 75176, for conducting the special election within the City. Early voting by personal appearance will be conducted each weekday as outlined in Exhibit "A".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS:

Section 1. Findings.

The facts and recitations contained in the preamble of this ordinance are hereby found and declared to be true and correct legislative findings and are adopted as part of this ordinance for all purposes.

Section 2. <u>Election Order; Election Date; Purpose of Election.</u>

A special election of the City shall be held on November 5, 2019, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., at those Election Day voting sites as determined by the Elections Administrator, for the following purposes:

(1) To consider one (1) ballot proposition for City Charter amendment.

Section 3. Proposed City Charter Amendment.

At the election the following amendment to the City Charter shall be submitted to the



resident, qualified voters of the City of Waxahachie:

PROPOSITION NO. A

Shall Section 2.01(c) of the City Charter be amended to read as follows (words removed noted by **strikeouts**; words added noted in **bold and underlined**):

Election and terms. The regular election of councilmen shall be held on the first Saturday of April May in each year. Each voter shall be entitled to vote for one as many candidates for each city council place on the ballot. as there are members to be elected to the council. The members of the city council shall hold their office for a term of two years and until their successors have been elected and qualified. The councilmen in the office at the time of the adoption of this charter shall continue in office until the expiration of the term for which they were elected, subject to the provisions of this charter, so that three councilmen shall be elected at the election to be held on the first Saturday in April, 1972, and two councilmen shall be elected at the election to be held on the first Saturday in April, 1973; and annually thereafter there shall be elected three and two councilmen, respectively; that is, in each odd-numbered year two councilmen shall be elected and in each even-numbered year three councilmen shall be elected. Beginning with the election in May, 2020, City Council Places 1, 2, and 3 shall be established, and any eligible candidate may run for office for one of the three Places. Beginning with the election in May, 2021, City Council Places 4 and 5 shall be established, and any eligible candidate may run for office for one of the two Places. All City Council Places shall be at large and no candidate need live in any particular geographic location of the City to be eligible to run for a City Council Place. The candidate receiving the greatest number of votes in each City Council Place shall be elected as the Council Member for that City Council Place.

Section 4. Severability Clause; Conflicts with Election Services Agreement.

If any word, section, article, phrase, paragraph, sentence, clause, or portion of this ordinance or application thereto to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this ordinance; and the City Council hereby declares it would have passed such remaining portions of this ordinance despite such invalidity which remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect. Additionally, it is the intent of the City Council in adopting this ordinance to fully comply with the terms of the Election Services Agreement. Should any conflict arise between any term of this ordinance and the City's obligations under the Election Services Agreement, it is the express intent of the City Council that the terms of the Election Services Agreement should control and govern—the administration of the general and special election addressed in this ordinance.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and publication in accordance with and as provided by law and the City Charter.
