1. Call to Order

President John Sanders called the meeting to order.

2. Approval of minutes of the Waxahachie Community Development Corporation meetings of November 14, 2017 and November 28, 2017

Action:

Vice President Mike Ramsey moved to approve minutes of the WCDC meetings of November 14, 2017 and November 28, 2017. Mr. Daniel Morton seconded, All Ayes.

3. Consider funding for the Amphitheater construction project

President Sanders recapped previous meetings discussing the Amphitheater project and stated it takes approximately three (3) million in bond funding to complete the project. He stated through discussion it was determined the project could be funded, but other alternatives would help with the balance sheet. President Sanders reported at the recent Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone No. 1 (TIRZ) meeting the board approved 1 million dollars. TIRZ also approved 1/3 of the ongoing yearly maintenance cost for the Amphitheater. He reported the project plans are 75% completed. The splash pad will be broken into three (3) pieces to be utilized as needed. After meeting with Oncor to redirect overhead power lines and it was determined it can be achieved.

Mr. Jim Phillips, 606 West Marvin, Waxahachie, stated Halff and Associates, Inc. discussed the trestle and how it can be reutilized. He stated the park can open without it.

City Manager Michael Scott suggested when the city goes out for bids, restrooms and trestle can be bid as alternates.

The Board held discussion. Mr. Layne Ballard stated he is 100% in favor of the park but still struggling with the splash pad and the location of the pad as well as the cost, operation and use.

Action:

President John Sanders moved to approve Waxahachie Community Development Corporation bonding capacity up to 2 million for the Amphitheater construction project. Mayor Kevin Strength seconded, All Ayes.

4. Consider CVB Sponsorship for Signage at Texas Motorplex

Ms. Laurie Mosley, Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB) Director, addressed the Board regarding CVB Sponsorship for Signage at the Texas Motorplex. She stated in September the Board held discussion about signage and billboards welcoming folks to Waxahachie. Ms. Mosley stated funds can be used for signage and billboards or we can advertise with the Texas Motorplex.

Texas Motorplex General Manager Andy Carter stated with their new schedule their goal is to fill hotels in Waxahachie three (3) to four (4) times a year. He noted Waxahachie has more to offer in terms of stays, shopping and restaurants.

Ms. Mosley stated advertising at Texas Motorplex is a healthy way to advertise and gives us an established presence at the Motorplex year-a-round.

Texas Motorplex Sales Director Terry Smith presented a handout depicting a 10' x 20' grand stand billboard noting it will be highly visible at all events and from the highway. The yearly commitment cost is \$10,000 and will include logo inclusion on highway marquee, logo with link on Motorplex home page, listing on corporate partner's page and special ticket pricing for events including hospitality for AAA Texas NHRA Fall Nationals.

Ms. Mosley stated it will be a good return on our investment and give both parties an opportunity to be financial partners.

Action:

After further discussion, Mr. Bob Lynn moved to approve sponsorship for signage at Texas Motorplex as presented. Vice President Mike Ramsey seconded, All Ayes.

5. Hear update of activities from Convention & Visitors Bureau Director

Ms. Mosley, Director of Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB), reported the Christmas parade and tree lighting was successful; it had a large attendance. She noted over 25,000 visited Bethlehem Revisited. Tour groups spent the night attending events around town.

6. Hear update of activities at the Civic Center

Ms. April Ortiz, Director of Civic Center, reported November closed with 39 events. WaxaCon was successful and they booked for 2018. December currently has 36 events booked. The Jr. Service League Christmas Market was very well attended. The Daddy/Daughter dance is expected to have 425 in attendance. The Bird blockers are installed. Mr. Bob Stoffels is working with the City Engineer on the sewer for the fountain outside the Crepe Myrtle room and plans should be back in January for consideration.

7. Hear update of activities at the Sports Complex

Mr. James Villarreal, Recreational Superintendent, reported they are working on bookings for 2018 for spring/summer tournaments. He reported Reliable Paving will start the large parking lot on the east side with seal coat and restriping. The triangle area is getting prepared for concrete. He reported there will be new concrete parking near the baseball fields and the parking lots on the west side need to be stripped. Restrooms are being cleaned and painted.

President Sanders stated with the base bid and alternates approximately \$97,000 left over and be left for next year.

8. Hear update of Community Beautification

Mr. Chris Seale, Horticulturist, stated planters have been changed out for winter colors and bulbs are being planted for the spring.

President Sanders stated the lights and hanging lights on the square look very nice. He recommended Mr. Seale visit with SAGU on how they install their Christmas lights.

9. Public Comments

Ms. Amy Hedtke, 106 Vanderbilt, Waxahachie, stated the school projects were voted down because things are all ready to high noting if the City wants to support the school district, the city taxes need to be lowered. She urged the Board to throw out the Amphitheater project, billboards, etc. noting something has to give.

10. Adjourn

There being no further business, Mr. Daniel Morton moved the meeting adjourn at 4:05 p.m. Vice President Mike Ramsey seconded, All Ayes.



Consideration of Using CVB Contingency Funds for 2018 Texas Country Reporter Festival



The financial reports for the 2016 and 2017 *Texas Country Reporter Festival* are attached showing the revenue and expenses for each year along with the budget forecast for 2018.

With the reimbursement, there would still be a short-fall of \$11,000 to cover for 2018 that we will attempt to cover through sponsorships and booth rentals.

Moving forward, I would like to propose to budget \$10,000 each year in the CVB budget for a sponsorship of the *Texas Country Reporter Festival*.

The biggest thing that is not captured on the financials is the positive economic impact this event creates for our local businesses and hotels, plus the countless dollars of television and radio publicity that Waxahachie receives at no charge for hosting this event.

Local organizations like the Waxahachie Downtown Merchants Association have been able to use the event as a fundraiser thru beer sales creating dollars that they are able to reinvest in downtown events/promotions throughout the year.

Our city also benefits from long-term gifts like the mural on the side of the building across from the Ellis County Museum that would have normally cost \$25,000 for only the price of materials because it was an activity at the festival.

This is the largest one-day arts & crafts festival in the state of Texas, and I appreciate your support of the event.
















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Beautification Department Report:

February 13th, 2018

Completed Projects

- The Parking Garage wall planters were repaired and planted. I'm having issues with the drainage
 in planter 3 and planter 10. I've removed the soil out of #3 and it looks like I'll have to remove
 the liner to see what's going on underneath it.
- The Berms at the Sports Complex are almost complete. I'm waiting on a tree and plant shipment. I've decided to wait on planting annual color until spring (March 15th).
- The spring bulbs are all in the ground and coming up as scheduled. What to look for:
 Paperwhites- Clusters of fragrant white blooms on upright stems about 15 inches tall
- I planted 4 Avondale redbud trees at Bynum Plaza. Avondale's are quite unique as far as redbuds go. These trees are multi-trunk similar to a crape myrtle and grow upright with the same bright purple/pink blooms in the spring.
- I added small trees and shrubs to the planters at the Bypass as well as in the Downtown area.
 They are much more noticeable and create more of a presence. Some will be removed and some will stay the closer we get to the summer.
- Pond Landscape at Sports Complex. I removed what was left of the shrub roses at the top of the bed and replaced them with kaleidoscope abelia. I then surrounded the new shrubs with a chicken wire fence to keep beavers from destroying them. I placed a trail camera in the bed facing the pond to see if said beavers are still in the area.

Projects Currently Working On

- Park Schoolhouse Road (Service Enhancement). I'm in the process of sorting through the asbuilds to get an idea on where and how many water meters will be needed. I've reached out to James Gaertner, the City Engineer, to help decipher the drawing. He's been a big help on this project.
- Broadhead Road (Service Enhancement). Still in the planning phase. I want to get Park
 Schoolhouse planned out before I start Broadhead.
- Parking Garage Landscape (Service Enhancement). I hired Kimley-Horn to create construction documents for this project.
- Woman's Building. Planning stage. After looking at the as-builds, it had been determined that a little more irrigation work is needed before starting on the flowerbed at the sign.
- Madison X Elm. Very small project across from Parks and Recreation offices. Creating a decomposed granite walkway on one half and a mulched bed on the other, with 2 planters in between the crape myrtles.
